**The Harvest**, the Fruits of Human of Work, and the Reverent Use of Creation.

**The Spread of the Gospel** especially on Evangelii Gaudium Day (3rd Sunday in September) & on World Mission Day (penultimate Sunday in October)

**Justice and Peace** in the world especially on Harvest Fast Day (1st Friday in October)

**Prisoners and their Families** especially on the Day of Prayer for Prisoners and their Dependants (2nd Sunday in October) and during Prisons Week (2nd week in October)

**All Victims of War** especially on Remembrance Sunday (2nd Sunday in November)

**Young People** especially on Youth Day (Christ the King).

#### ADVENTUROUS ACCOMPANIMENT - ONE MORE WEEK TO SIGN UP!

"We need a Church capable of walking at people's side... a church which accompanies them on their journey". Pope Francis calls for us to be initiated into the "art of accompaniment". As a community and individually, we can extend God's love to others and walk shoulder-to-shoulder with them in life and faith.

The Adventurous Accompaniment programme explores how to walk alongside people we encounter in life and faith - living out LOVE YOUR NEIGHBOUR AS YOURSELF. Join us over 6 weeks in September and October. This programme is aimed at anyone who wants to develop their skills as an accompanier (including all those involved in a ministry).

We are providing two offerings a week, both in-person, in St Joseph's Church Hall:

- Tuesday evenings, 7.30 pm (for a 7.45 pm start) <u>Starting 12th</u>
   <u>September</u>, for six weeks
- Wednesday mornings, 10.45 am (for an 11 am start) <u>Starting 13th</u>

### **SAFEGUARDING**

The Catholic Safeguarding Standards Agency (CSSA) has commissioned the services of the Social Care Institute for Excellence (SCIE) to review the safeguarding policies and procedures of the Catholic Church. This work has now commenced.

To ensure that the review team take into consideration as many views as possible, people from across our Church community are encouraged to

complete the survey. The CSSA want to hear from individuals across all areas and levels within dioceses, parishes, religious life groups (RLGs), the Religious Life Safeguarding Service (RLSS), and victims and survivors, about their experiences of using existing safeguarding policies and practice guidance.

This is an opportunity to help shape the future of safeguarding within the Catholic Church and make representations where it is evident - or perceived - that current policies and procedures:

- are outdated
- contain gaps i.e. there isn't policy for a given situation
- are difficult to work with or interpret for other reasons.
