



A reflection from Bishop Richard...

Our celebration of Holy Week draws ever closer – next Sunday will be Palm Sunday – and this week's readings at Mass enable us to reflect on the wonder of the Resurrection.

Ezekiel speaks of the new life that is found when the people of Israel are restored to the promised land. Their experience of death has been that of exile – life for them is a return home to the place where they can breathe freely and live freely. We might reflect, as we hear these

words, that there are so many people across our world today who – as refugees, exiles, asylum seekers – desire their homeland, the place where rest and peace should be found. May our prayer and reflection drive us to action to support and care for those driven from their homelands.

The lament of Psalm 129 – the De Profundis – expresses the yearning that seeks the Lord, and the forgiveness that only He can give. In this Lenten Season, we must be like the watchman, looking out for the Lord, seeking Him with all our hearts, that we may know forgiveness and peace.

We hear in this week's Gospel, the account of Lazarus rising from the dead. Mary's faith in Jesus – "I know he will rise again at the Resurrection on the last day" – is fulfilled there and then as Lazarus is raised from the dead. Jesus is alive and active in our lives too. His death and Resurrection is life for us, both here and now and in the world to come. St Paul expresses this in the clearest terms – "the Spirit of Him who raised Jesus from the dead is living in you."

We are people of the Resurrection right now. That life that enables us to live freely, to be open to the Lord who brings us forgiveness and new life. Our call is to bring that message of new life to our brothers and sisters. As we prepare to celebrate the death and Resurrection of Christ, let us put behind us – through the celebration of the Sacrament of Penance – all that would keep us from living this life that is within us, all that would prevent us from proclaiming the Resurrection to the world.
