



Today we begin Holy Week as we enter Jerusalem with Jesus, who makes His journey into Jerusalem in humility, but is hailed by the crowds.

Isaiah's prophecy is all about the suffering servant. The Lord Himself is, in fact, the One who carries the burden – the burden of our sins. This prophecy, this truth about the load that the Lord carries for us – is lived out in the week ahead.

Isaiah calls to us also, that we may walk with the Lord. St Paul, in the hymn that comes at the beginning of his letter to the Philippians, outlines in poetic form the mystery of the birth, death, and rising of Christ. The Gospel – the account of the Passion – places us all in

the events that are to come.

As we listen, in prayer, to the reading of the Passion, may this account of our salvation find its home in us. As we follow Him to the Mount of Olives and into Jerusalem, so we walk with Jesus on every step of the road to Calvary.

As you make the Holy Week Journey, imagine yourself with Him. Be with Him in your mind and heart, in the Upper Room as He eats the Last Supper with His friends; watch with Him the Garden of Gethsemane where He prays and is arrested, be with Him in the house of Caiaphas where he is questioned, and as He is taken to Pontius Pilate, flogged, and condemned to death; follow Him as He carries His cross; stand there with Mary His Mother, John the Apostle and Mary Magdalen as He suffers and dies. Then, on Saturday, sit quietly by the tomb.

The more we enter into the Holy Week journey, the more we come to understand all that the Lord has done for us. The more we come to understand, the closer we come to the One who has saved us through His death and resurrection.
