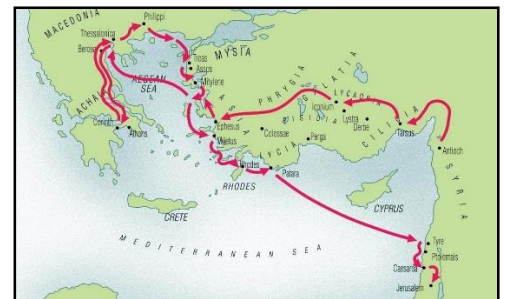


# Saint Peter and Paul Cupcakes

St Peter was a fisherman before he responded to Jesus called for him and his brother to become “fishers of men”. St. Paul went out to spread the good news about Jesus, after his conversion and would have travelled by boat to get to some of the places he went, as you can see from the map. So today we’re going to make boat cupcakes while we think about the lives of St Peter and St Paul.

## You will need:

- Your favourite cupcake mix. (here's one you could use <https://www.bbcgoodfood.com/recipes/cupcakes>)
- White butter icing
- Blue cupcake cases (you can always put blue strips round the cupcake cases as shown in the picture)
- Cocktail Sticks
- Sail outlines on the following page
- Colouring pens/pencils
- Sweets that look like a boat

## To make your cupcakes

1. Bake your cupcakes in the blue cupcake cases
2. While they are cooking print the sails on the next page and decorate them with symbols of Saint Peter and Saint Paul. You could use images from stories you know about their lives or symbols like the keys associated with St Peter. This will be a good time to find out more about Saint Peter, you could use the videos on the [children's liturgy page](#).
3. Stick your cocktail stick through the sail as shown in the picture and into the boat sweet
4. Cover your cupcake with white butter icing
5. Place the sweet on top of the cake
